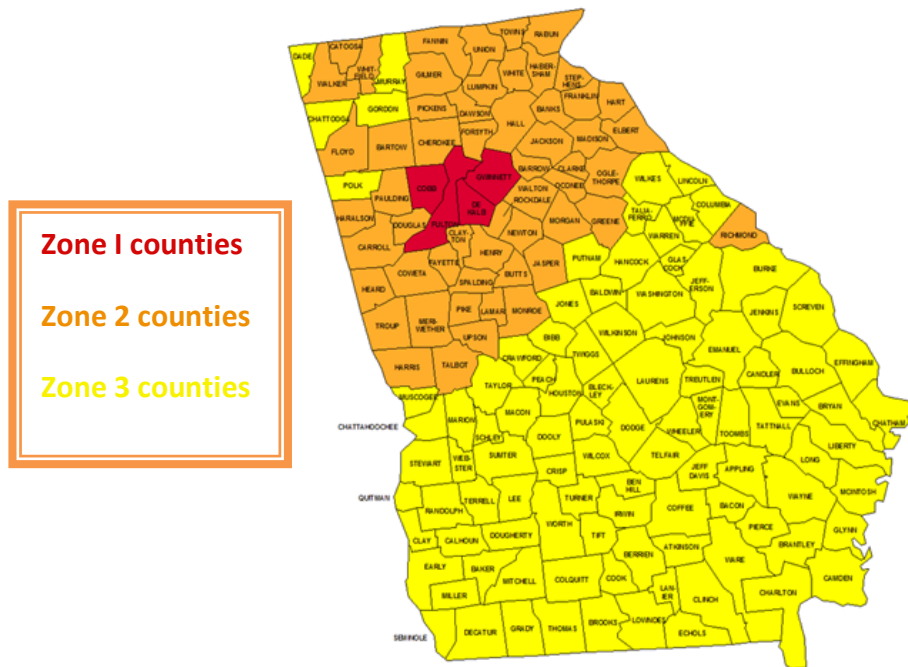


Georgia Radon Levels

These maps should not be used as a substitute for an actual radon test. The only way to determine radon concentrations in a building is to test.



Radon is the leading cause of lung cancer in non-smokers causing over 21,000 deaths per year. Over 800 people in Georgia die each year from exposure to radon gas. In Georgia, the Georgia department of Community Affairs receives funding from EPA for Radon education. The DCA contracts with the University of Georgia Cooperative Extension Service to provide statewide radon education and information.
