

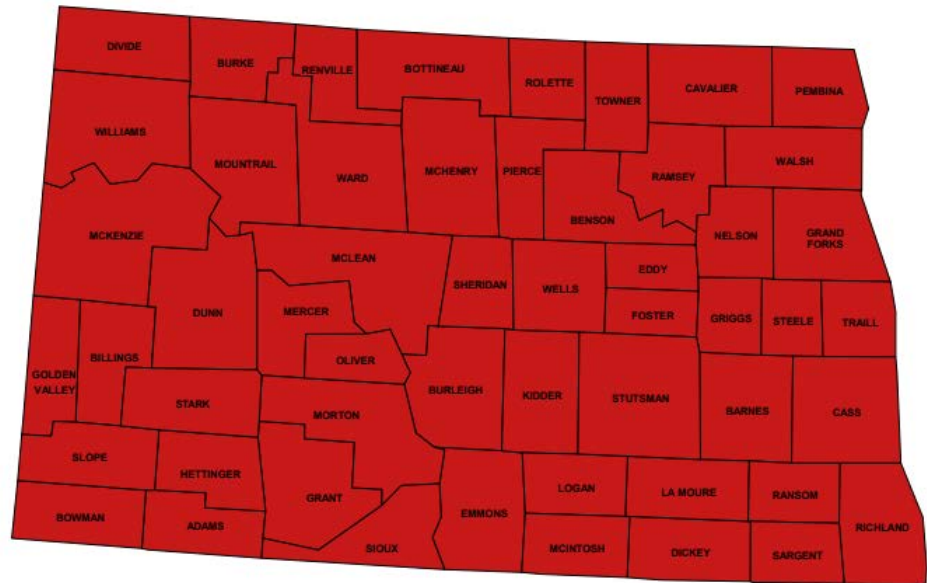
# North Dakota Radon Fact Sheet




## NORTH DAKOTA RADON AWARENESS PROGRAM

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-  Zone 1 – Higher potential for radon levels above the 4 pCi/l guideline.
-  Zone 2 – moderate potential for radon levels above the 4 pCi/l guideline.
-  Zone 3 – Lower potential for radon levels above the 4 pCi/l guideline.

The North Dakota Department of Health works to safeguard the health and environment of North Dakota. Programs within the Division deal with issues that affect the comfort, health, safety and well-being of all North Dakota citizens and their environment.

The NDDoAQ Radon Program has utilized the United States Environmental Protection Agency's State Indoor Radon Grant (SIRG) and other Federal programs to help operate the State's Radon Program since 1988. This funding has been critical to the success of the State's Radon Program. Through this assistance, the Department completed radon surveys of homes, clusters, daycare facilities, schools and homes served by the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program during the years 1988-1993.

## Pending/Enacted Legislation

There are no pending or enacted legislation in North Dakota.

## North Dakota Cancer Control Plan

The Plan includes:

- Conduct educational campaigns about the carcinogenic risks of radon in the home, how to test for radon, sources for obtaining test kits and removal of radon from the home.
- Educate the public, employers, health professionals and policy makers about cancer-related environmental exposures including but not limited to radon, asbestos, lead, mold, erionite, pesticides and home-use products.
