





EPA and ANSI-AARST Radon Measurement Standards recommend fixing a building with a radon level \geq (above or equal to) 4 pCi/L and consider fixing it if any radon level is \geq 2 and < (below) 4 pCi/L.

Radon Mitigation Service Providers Solutions

- Focus on Existing Industries for Solutions: Target established professions that align naturally with radon mitigation tasks, including:
 - Plumbers
 - Electricians
 - HVAC Technicians
 - Construction General Contractors
 - Excavation Professionals
- Rationale for These Industries:
 - They possess the essential trade skills required for the work.
 - They inherently value credentialing, which is beneficial in Montana (where credentials are not mandated and the terrain poses territorial challenges).
 - Achieved at least 90% voluntary credentialing among participants.
- Effectiveness in Montana:
 - This approach has proven successful, resulting in at least a 5X increase in the number of mitigators (minimum) across all 56 frontier counties in just 2 years.






