Policy and Advocacy

In Colorado, as of July 1, 2022, anyone performing radon measurement or mitigation must be licensed under the **Radon Measurement and Mitigation Licensing Act**. The law was passed to protect the public from unqualified individuals, since radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer and a major health risk in Colorado.

Licensure is regulated through the **Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA), Office of Radon Professionals**.

Policy and Advocacy, cont...

Effective sellers and landlords of residential property in Colorado to disclose known **radon hazards**, including past test results, mitigation system details, and provide state-issued educational materials. Real estate sales contracts must include a **radon warning statement**, and landlords must provide disclosures in writing to tenants.

The law holds sellers, landlords, and realtors accountable for compliance but does not mandate testing or mitigation. Tenants in leases longer than one year may void the lease if landlords fail to disclose or address elevated radon levels.
